


Child Mortality Reduced by 2/3 from 1990 to 2015




Maternal Mortality 1990-2015



Trends in Children's Nutritional Status


Percent of children under 5, based on 2006 WHO Child Growth Standards


Tanzania Community Health Worker and Conditional Cash Transfer Trial

- i) Home-based Health, Nutrition and Stimulation Intervention delivered by community health workers (CHW) <u>every 4-6 weeks</u>
- ii) CHW + Conditional cash transfers for ANC and Growth Monitoring (~4.30 USD ANC and ~2.15 USD child growth monitoring)
